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Cunningham's WV Lions Paw Pad Roars, Produces 100K Bbl of Oil

The Big Injun is back in the news. In 2015 Cunningham Energy, a small oil driller based in West Virginia, struck oil in the Big Injun sandstone formation in Clay County, WV (see <u>Cunningham Strikes Oil in West Virginia's Big Injun Territory</u>). In 2017 the company reported producing 20,000 barrels of oil from two new shallow horizontal oil wells located

in Clay County, targeting the Big Injun (see <u>Cunningham Energy Strikes More Oil in WV</u>). Cunningham drilled two more wells on the same pad, the Lions Paw pad, and as of this week that 4-well pad has surpassed producing a total of 100,000 barrels of oil and 91 million cubic feet (MMcf) of "wet" natural gas.

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
